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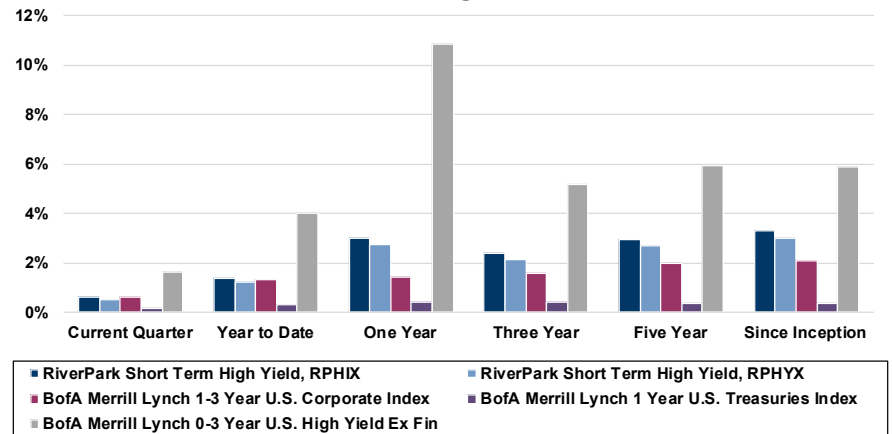
## Investment Objective

The RiverPark Short Term High Yield Fund seeks high current income and capital appreciation consistent with the preservation of capital.

## Investment Strategy

The RiverPark Short Term High Yield Fund focuses on short term high yield securities for which they believe credit ratings do not accurately reflect a company's ability to meet their short term credit obligations. The RiverPark Short Term High Yield Fund seeks to make investments in fixed income securities of companies that have announced or, in Cohanzyck's opinion, will announce a funding event, reorganization or other corporate event that they believe will have a positive impact on a company's ability to repay their debt. Additionally, the Fund will invest in securities in which it perceives there is limited near term risk of default. In Cohanzyck's view, the risks associated with investing in short term high yield debt are very different from investing in long-dated paper in which operating performance and business sustainability are of primary concern.

This subset includes all securities with a remaining term to maturity of less than 3 years. The BofA Merrill Lynch 1-Year U.S. Treasuries Index is an unmanaged index that tracks the performance of the direct sovereign debt of the U.S. Government having a maturity of at least one year and less than three years. The BofA Merrill Lynch 0-3 Year U.S. High Yield Index Excluding Financials considers all securities from the BofA Merrill Lynch US High Yield Master II Index and the BofA Merrill Lynch U.S. High Yield 0-1 Year Index, and then applies the following filters: securities greater than or equal to one month but less than 3 years to final maturity, and exclude all securities with Level 2 sector classification = Financial (FNCL).
